





Minutes of 4th learning, teaching and training activities meeting

of the KA2 Erasmus+ project 'Power @pp Your Learning Skills' - (P@LS) 2016-1-EL01-KA219-023437

held at IES Castillo de Luna in La Puebla de Cazalla, Spain, from 25th February 2018 to 3rd March 2018.

The fourth learning, teaching and training activities meeting of the KA2 Erasmus+ project 'Power @pp Your Learning Skills' - (P@LS) was held at IES Castillo de Luna in La Puebla de Cazalla, Spain, from 25th February to 3rd March 2018.

The Greek delegation from the 1st Esperino EPAL of Trikala arrived in Seville on the 25th of February and departed on the 3rd of March. The delegation was made up of two teachers and one student.

The Turkish delegation from the Yavuz Sultan Selim Mesleki ve Teknik Anadolu Lisesi, in Osmaniye arrived in Seville on the 25th of February and departed on the 3rd of March. The delegation was made up of three teachers and four students.

The Hungarian delegation from the Móricz Zsigmond Református Kollégium, Gimnázium, Szakgimnázium és Általános Iskola, in Kisújszállás arrived in Seville on the 25th of February and departed on 3rd of March. The delegation was composed by four teachers and four students.

The Italian delegation from the Liceo Scientifico M. Curie, in Tradate arrived in Seville on the 24th of February and departed on the 3rd of March. The delegation was made up of two teachers and five students.

The Portuguese delegation from the Agrupamento de Escolas de Barcelos, in Barcelos arrived in Seville on the 25th of February and departed on the 3rd of March. The delegation was made up of two teachers and two students.

IES Castillo de Luna in La Puebla de Cazalla was the host organisation of the 4th learning, teaching and training activities meeting.

The Greek, the Turkish, the Hungarian and the Portuguese delegations were welcomed by the host organisation on the 25th of February, and the Italian participants were welcomed on the 24th of February.

The events of the meeting were organised and realised mostly according to the agenda, which was previously compiled by the host school.







On the 26th of February at 09:30 the Major of La Puebla de Cazalla, Don Antonio Martín Molero, welcomed all the delegations in the Hacienda La Fuenlonguilla and gave his opening speech and a presentation introducing the place. That place is a beautiful old hacienda not far from the village and where a well-known Flamenco Festival is held in its patio every summer. Nowadays, there is the Museum about the importance of oil in the area. There's also an ancient oil mill that has been restored. A small exhibition about Flamenco singers, dancers and players can also be seen there.

At 10:30 the participants left the hacienda to start a sightseeing route through the streets of La Puebla de Cazalla. The group walked from the Hacienda La Fuenlonguilla to the town centre and they were all astonished. It's a very small and quiet village like many Andalusian villages, where time seems to have stopped in some corners. Afterwards, the group followed the guided route: the Convent, the Library, the Square of Andalusia, the Town Hall and its Square, the House of the Flamenco singer Lola Lucena, the Museum, the Parish Church.

At 13:00, all the delegations arrived at the host school IES Castillo de Luna. There was a welcoming meeting at the Assembly Hall-Gym of the school with other students and members of the Educational Community. Some videos about Seville and La Puebla de Cazalla, which had been achieved by the host school students, were shown as a presentation to the area where the school is situated. A memory video about the previous meeting in Kisújszállás was also played by the organizing school.

After lunch, at 16:00 all participants started the project activities. We attended a lesson on "Art throughout Mankind's History: a way to understand human thought and art itself", which was an idea and contents written by Juan G. Moreno Catena, Head of the Art Department.

In the afternoon, from 17:00 until 20:00 the delegation worked on the App designed in Spain: "Art in Motion". The Professional Program using MIT-APP inventor was introduced to all the delegations and they started working with "ArtInMotion". The specialized Spanish students were present to give instructions and check how it works. A supporting script was distributed to all participants with the following topics: 1) ArtInMotion user view; 2) Designing and blocking the screens; 3) All blocks. All steps were performed without difficulty. This application's main objective was to present the functionalities of the final application developed by the team. The App has two parts. First, there's a game which deals with matching art elements, that's to say, images of diverse architectural elements and monuments must be matched with the exact names of those elements shown. The second part is a list of explanations elaborated by the Spanish team about the architectural elements of the game and other references to history and geography. In this part, the user can also find the photos used in the game and the place where they were taken. All the photos used in the App are original and have been taken and processed by the Spanish Erasmus p@ls team.

On the 27th of February at 6:00 the Erasmus teachers left Seville to La Puebla de Cazalla where the students got on the bus, so that all had the possibility of a pleasant cultural trip to Granada. They had a scheduled visit to La Alhambra, first the Nasrid Palaces, Charles V Palace, the Generalife and the Alcazaba. The visit to La Alhambra took them four-five hours to visit the Generalife Gardens (summer palace of the kings), the Alcazaba with the view of Granada, the Palace of the Emperor Charles V and the jewel of this monument: the Nasrid Palaces.







The delegations were guided with art explanations prepared by the Spanish Erasmus team.

After eating their lunch in "La Gran Taberna", a well-known restaurant of Granada dishes, near La Alhambra, the participants strolled about in the old Jewish-Muslim quarter of Granada. Called "La Alcaicería", the quarter is much smaller than the Sevillian Jewish-Muslim quarter, but it's very close to the Cathedral and the amazing Royal Chapel. Unfortunately, they did not have time for a longer visit of Granada, which is a city worth staying for some days.

At 18:00 the bus took them near the hill of the Albaicín and they walked to San Nicolás Square. It is a magical place, though it tends to be crowded. The idea was to enjoy a fabulous sight, one of the most beautiful postcards in the world: La Alhambra, the snowed peaks of Sierra Nevada and the sunset.

The group arrived back to La Puebla at 22:00 and one hour later in Seville.

On the 28th of February (The Day of Andalusia), at 9:00 a bus waited for young visitors and their hosts in La Puebla at Bar Pachón and took them to Seville to visit some of its artistic and cultural highlights with their teachers. Then, Juan G. Moreno Catena, Head of the Art Department of the IES Castillo de Luna and History expert, took them to different parts of the city.

At 11:35 they enjoyed a booked visit to the Cathedral of Seville and its belfry "La Giralda". This is the biggest temple in Spain and one of the most impressive temples in the world. The view of the city from the top of "La Giralda" is excellent. They were guided with art explanations prepared by the Spanish Erasmus team.

At 13:00 the sightseeing continued after the visit to the Cathedral.

At 15:00 they all had lunch.

At 18:00, all the students left Seville. They had a party with all the students involved in the project in the Town Hall Youth Premises "El Encuentro" in La Puebla de Cazalla.

At 20:30 the teachers got lost in the lights of Seville by night and had dinner in "Bar Postiguillo", in the popular and historical quarter of El Arenal.

On the 1st of March at 09:00 the teachers left Seville to spend the whole day in La Puebla de Cazalla.

At 10:00 all participants worked on the App "Art in Motion" and after having lunch in a local restaurant, "El Jardal", they went back to school at 16:00 and they kept on working until they completed all the steps and finalised the App.

At 18:00 there was a teachers' meeting according to the agenda designed by Mrs. Aikaterini Banteka, their main coordinator. The students went back to their Spanish homes.

The topics of discussion were the following:

- 6. New dates for the 4th and 5th Newsletter
- 7. The Network of foreign schools to try our apps -Creation of a blog
- 8. Suggestions for the Turkish and Greek meeting to meet our application commitments
- 9. Maintenance of our Website, Twinspace and Facebook page
- 10. Arrangements of the Turkish meeting (participants-accommodation-travelling- expenses)
- 11. Arrangements of the Greek meeting (participants-accommodation-travelling-expenses)
- 12. A new multicultural activity on the project's twinspace which would be a UNESCO monument in each partner country presented in the form of a short video or ppt slides.

From 20:00 to 21:30 it was time to attend the Closing Ceremony at the Assembly Hall/Gym, where there was a concluding speech by the Headmistress and where the Certificates of Attendance were awarded to every participant in the meeting.

There was a short musical show performed by some of Spanish students. Flamenco and Andalusian folk music were deeply rooted in this village and it is an essential part of the Andalusian soul.

The dinner at school was held at 21:30. where the Erasmus teachers, the pupils with their hosts and the student's parents enjoyed some dishes cooked by the hosting families and drinks paid by the Mothers and Fathers' Association. They wanted to greet them and invite them to have an informal dinner and it was a pleasant time of togetherness. After this, the teachers came back to Seville and the students stayed with their hosts.

On the 2nd of March at 08:30 the students left La Puebla de Cazalla to Seville where the teachers were ready to go to Córdoba. They got on the bus which was coming from La Puebla with the students. As soon as they reached Córdoba, they went for a short walk. Here, they visited the Mezquita-Catedral de Cordoba. This Mosque-Cathedral was built during the 9th and 10th centuries. The group were guided with explanations about the history and art of this amazing building.

At 17:00 the delegations came back to La Puebla and Seville. All the students from the five countries enjoyed their last evening all together in La Puebla. The teachers had a good-bye dinner in a restaurant in Seville.

On the 3rd of March all delegations left Spain.


